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Farm Overview

Nestled between the Aravalli and Vindhya mountain ranges in the south-eastern part of Rajasthan, lies the Ranthambhore Aangan - the ideal getaway for adventurers and travellers alike. The property is spread across two acres of land amidst guava, mango orchards and other fruiting trees. The place is best suited for individual travelers or small groups who love peace and tranquility, enjoy being in the wild and experience magical sunrise over the mountains, sweet fragrances and the pleasant chirping sounds of sundry birds.

Ranthambore Aangan is a small boutique property on the periphery of the famous Ranthambore National Park, home to the world's most magnificent cat - the Bengal Tiger, a diverse variety of other species, mammals and birds; the park is peppered with picturesque ruins of ancient forts and monuments. The property is quaintly set up and exudes a rustic charm exclusively handcrafted to give an authentic experience of a farm stay.

The property has a total of 5 compact luxurious rooms with a mix of double and twin beds and is overlooking one of the core zones of the Ranthambore National Park - Zone 5.





Farm Location



The Ranthambhore Aangan is strategically located close to the world-famous Ranthambhore National Park, in a green belt area, at the edge of the reserve. Located right at the edge of the park, the property is away from the noise of the city and railway station, and offers a peaceful and rejuvenating experience to its guests. Besides the safaris, there are many activities and experiences that can be explored within Ranthambhore.

The National Park sprawls over an estimated area of 400 sq. kms. Steep crags embrace a network of lakes and rivers and at the top of one of these hills is the impressive Ranthambhore Fort, built in the 10th century. The park, besides the magnificent Bengal Tiger, is host to over 200 species of

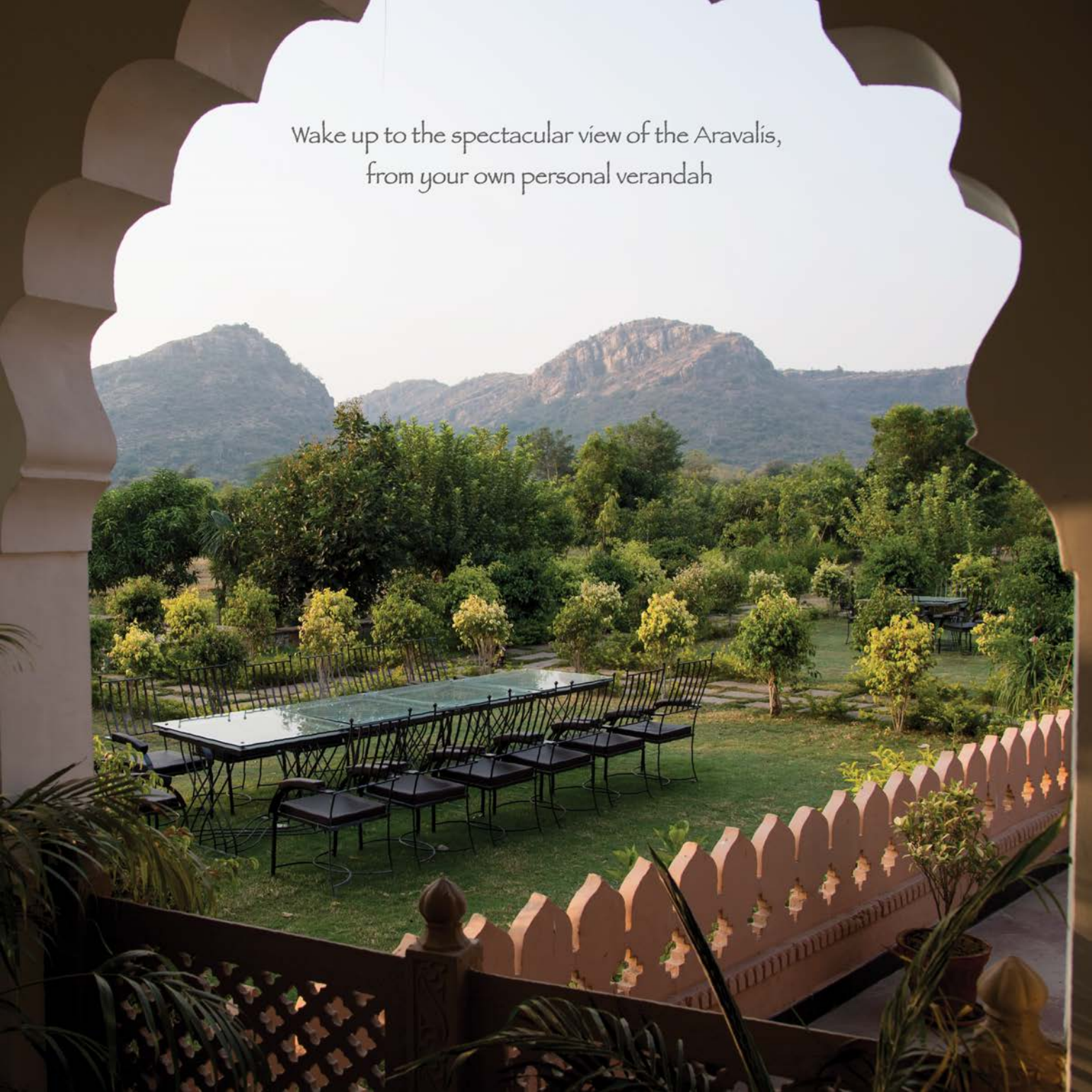


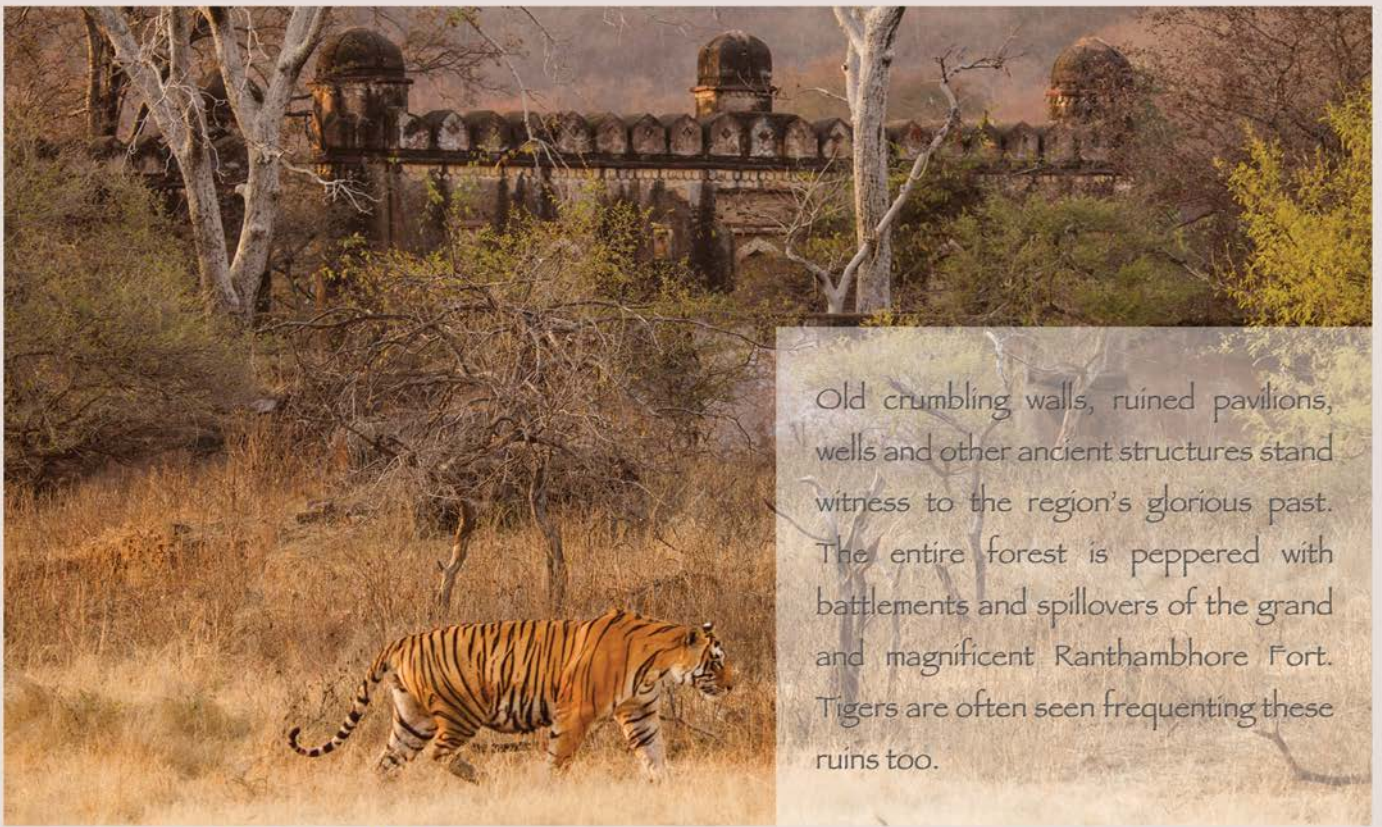
species of birds, both resident and migratory, leopards, jungle cats, striped hyenas, variety of antelopes & deer and wild boar. Ranthambhore National Park is one of the prime examples of Project Tiger's conservation efforts in Rajasthan.

The terrain fluctuates between impregnable forests and open bush land. The forest is typically dry, deciduous type, with Dhok (*Anogeissus pendula*) being the most prominent tree. The entry point to the Park heads straight to the foot of the fort, the famous Ganesh temple, and the forest rest house, Jogi Mahal. The latter boasts of the second-largest banyan tree in India. The Padam Lake, the Raj Bagh Lake and the Malik Lake are some of the prime Tiger real estates in the park, loved by humans and tigers alike, for its breathtaking views and abundance of prey. More than any other park in India, Tigers can be more actively spotted during the day here, at the edges of these lakes, and in and around at the Jogi Mahal area as well.

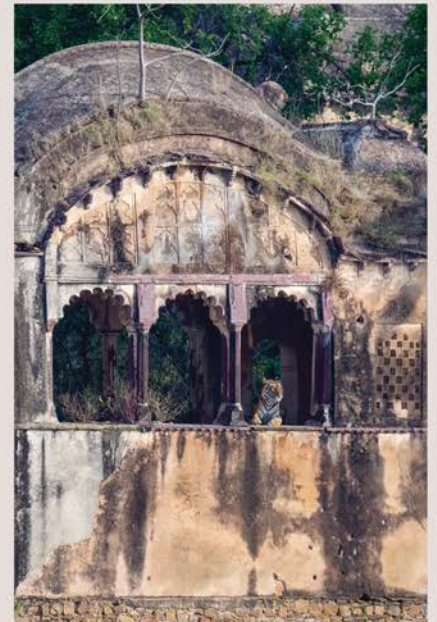


Wake up to the spectacular view of the Aravalis,

Getting there

Ranthambhore Aangan is located in Ranthambhore, Sawai Madhopur, in the state of Rajasthan in northwest India. The Ranthambhore Aangan is located barely a kilometre from the Ranthambore National Park's main entrance. The farm is approximately 180 kilometres from Jaipur, the capital of Rajasthan.

• **By air:** The closest airport is the Sanghaner airport in Jaipur, around 180 kms away and a three and a half hour drive from the hotel. Jaipur is well connected to the metro cities like New Delhi and Mumbai with daily flights operated by various airlines. The flying time from Jaipur to Delhi is about half an hour and from Jaipur to Mumbai is about an hour and a half. • **By Train:** Sawai Madhopur railway station (10 kms.) is on the main train line between Delhi and Mumbai and is also well connected to Jaipur. There are regular super fast trains like Jan Shatabadi , Rajdhani and several other trains between these destinations. The travel time from Sawai Madhopur to Jaipur is approximately two hours and thirty minutes, to Delhi around five hours and to Mumbai around thirteen hours. By Road: The drive from Jaipur to Ranthambhore Aangan is approximately three hours. The drive from Agra to Ranthambhore Aangan is approximately six hours. The drive from New Delhi to Ranthambhore Aangan via Jaipur, takes approximately six hours. The road distances are approximately 445 kms. from Delhi, 180 kms. from Jaipur and around 310 kms from Agra.

Best time to visit

Rajasthan experiences different seasons through the year. December-February are the typically colder months when it gets especially chilly in the mornings and evenings, while the day still remains pleasantly warm and sunny. The jungle safaris can get quite cold early mornings and late evenings during this period, therefore warm clothing becomes a necessity. March sees the onset of the summer months and by April it begins to get fairly warm, followed by the intensely hot and humid months of May and June. The beginning of July brings the onset of monsoon which last until the end of September. October and November are fairly pleasant months, neither too warm nor too cold or rainy. The best time to visit is from October- March.

The dry heat of Rajasthan can give rise to mosquitoes through the year, who usually come out early mornings and late evenings, so its advisable to carry insect repellants at all times, especially warmer months. The hotel regularly manages pest control in its premises and mosquito repellants and coils are provided in all rooms and outdoor areas.

The Hotel remains open throughout the year.
